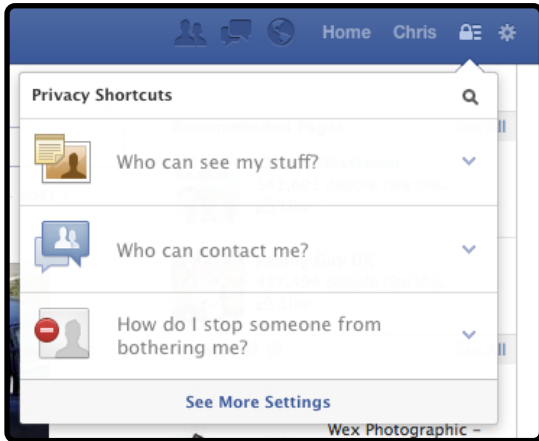

## Our E-Safety Pledge

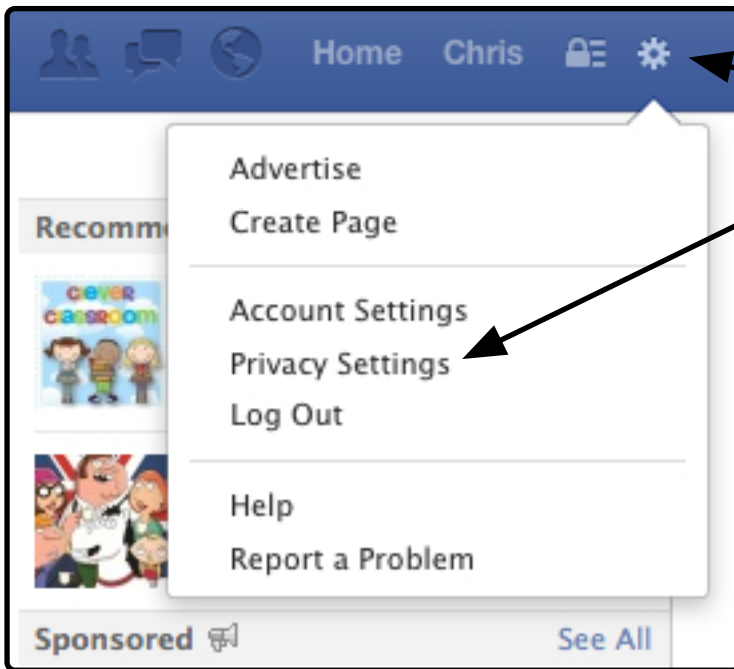

Click the cog in the corner and select 'Privacy Settings' to make additional changes.

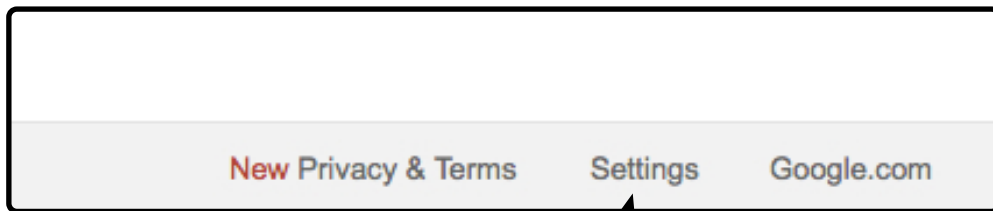

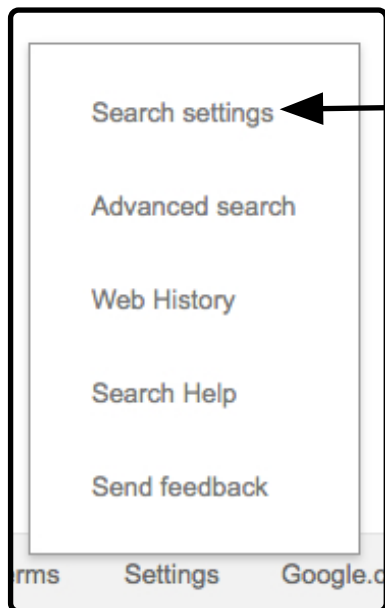

### Step 1

Access the Google homepage in the normal way (www.google.com). Click 'Settings'.



### Step 2

Select 'Search settings'

### **SafeSearch Filters**

Turn on **SafeSearch** to filter sexually explicit content from your search results.

Click to 'Filter explicit results'.

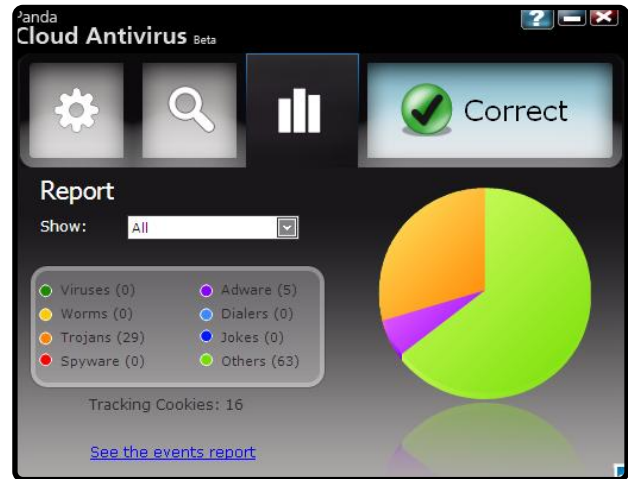
You may also 'lock' this setting, which requires a Google username and password to be entered.

There are a number of free Anti-Virus / Firewall applications that can help protect your computer at home. Here are a few:



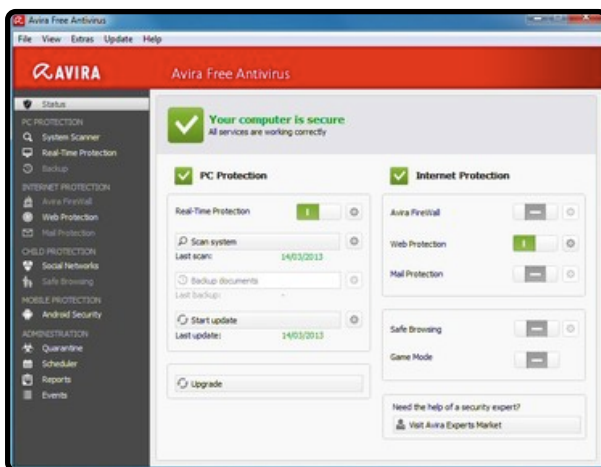

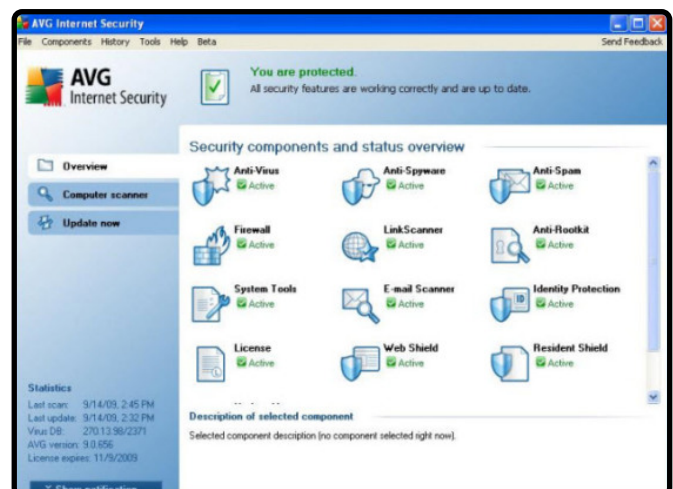

Open 'Settings'



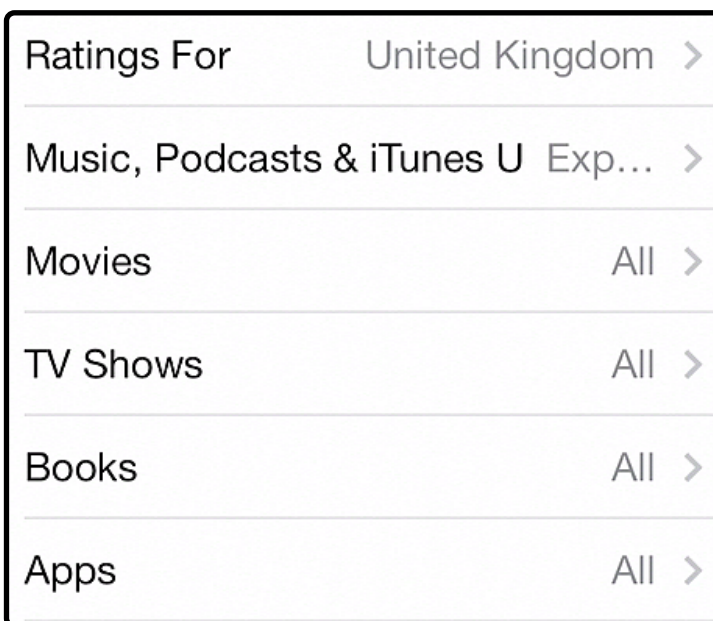
### Step 2
