	<p>In Term 1 and 2, our History topic is about the Stone Age. The children will explore the vast world of Prehistoric Britain and learn all about the first steps that our ancestors took. Through this topic, the children will gain an understanding of the Stone Age and how we know about the prehistoric past. At the end of the Topic, the children will be displaying their Stone Age homework projects in our class museum.</p> <p>To support and further your child's learning, we ask that you undertake a project together. Maths	Numbersense/Studyzone	
	<p>In class, children will be using a program called Numbersense. This allows them to develop their addition and subtraction skills.</p> <p>Each week, the class teacher will send home strategies and games you can try at home. This will support teaching in school. There is no time limit, however, the more practise the better!</p> <p>If you wish to, you can practise your times tables on Studyzone. Your login and password are in your learning journal. The website also has additional activities that you might like to access too.</p> <p>The more practise the better! The quicker you learn your number facts, the more you will be able to use them to help you with your Maths work.</p>	
Reading	Accelerated Reading (AR)	
	<p>Read independently or, even better, with an adult. Read carefully and discuss the text with an adult so you can maximise your score when you quiz on the book at school. The children are expected to read for 15mins three times a week minimum.</p>	
Spelling	Set start of term	Tested weekly and parents will be informed of scores.
	<p>You will be given a card with spellings to learn <u>each week</u>. Your teacher will tell you which spellings to learn each week.</p> <p>Focus on the weekly set, revisiting previous weeks too. You will be practising them at school, using a range of strategies to help you to learn them, but it is really important that you practise at home too. Ask an adult to help you. You could highlight each word once you can <u>definitely</u> spell it! At the end of each week, there will be a test on the words you have been learning that week.</p>
