## Terms 5 & 6



<b>Project</b>	<b>Due in: Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July 2022</b>	
	<p>During Terms 5 and 6, we will be studying the Romans! Children will be investigating who the Romans were and their impact on Britain. For your project, we would like you to research an area of Roman life that interests you and produce a Roman artefact. It could be part of Ancient Roman culture we have looked at in class or it could be completely different altogether.</p> <p>Be creative! Your project could take the form of a model with accompanying notes/writing, a report, a PowerPoint presentation with notes or video. However, the project must reflect the extended time you have had to do it. Due to limited space in our classrooms, we ask that your projects remain at home until the due date on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July.</p> <p>We will inform parents/carers of how we will present these projects in Term 6.</p>	
<b>Maths</b>	<b>Studyzone</b>	
	<p>You are expected to spend a minimum of 20 minutes a week practising your times tables on Studyzone. Your login and password are in your learning journal.</p> <p><b>The more practise the better!</b> The quicker you learn your times tables, the more you will be able to use them to help you with your Maths work.</p> <p>The class teacher will be checking if you have practised or not. If you do not have access to the internet then do let you teacher know, and extra provision will be put in place to allow you to practise.</p> <p>The website also has additional activities that you might like to access too.</p>	
<b>Reading</b>	<b>Accelerated Reading (AR)</b>	
	<p>Read independently or, even better, with an adult. Read carefully and discuss the text with an adult so you can maximise your score when you quiz on the book at school. The children are expected to read for 15mins three times a week minimum.</p>	
<b>Spelling</b>	Set start of term	Tested weekly and parents will be informed of scores.
	<p>You will be given a card with spellings to learn <u>for the term</u>.</p> <p><b>Don't try to learn them all at once.</b></p> <p>Focus on the weekly set, revisiting previous weeks too. You will be practising them at school, using a range of strategies to help you to learn them, but it is really important that you practise at home too. Ask an adult to help you. You could highlight each word once you can <u>definitely</u> spell it! At the end of the term, there will be a huge spelling challenge to see how many of the words you can spell.</p>
