



2022-2023 Progress at Herne Bay Junior School

Following the COVID-19 pandemic, most exams, tests and assessments resumed in academic year 2021/22. Pupils included in the 2022/23 KS2 school performance data experienced varying levels of disruption to their schooling due to the pandemic.

The government's progress measures aim to capture the progress that pupils make during key stage 2. They are a type of value added measure, which means that pupils' results are compared to the actual achievements of other pupils nationally with similar prior attainment.

This type of progress measure rewards schools for making progress with all of their pupils, whether they are low, middle or high prior attainers.

As an example:

- A progress score of 0 means pupils in this school, on average, do about as well in key stage 2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- A positive score means pupils in this school on average make more progress across key stage 2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- A negative score means pupils in this school on average make less progress across key stage 2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally.

Below you will find a table detailing the progress scores for reading, writing and maths at Herne Bay Junior School.

| Reading | Writing | Maths |

The progress scores shown above sit within a confidence band. Whilst the given score cannot be deemed to be 100% accurate, it can be said with confidence that the progress does sit within the confidence band for each subject.
